**Liberty Hall Historic Site Offers Free Admission on Museum Day,
Saturday, September 26**

All visitors to Liberty Hall and the Orlando Brown House in Frankfort will receive free admission on Saturday, September 26. The historic site will be open from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with tours of Liberty Hall at 10:30, 12:00, 1:30, and 3:00. All tours leave from the Orlando Brown House at 202 Wilkinson St. in Frankfort. Liberty Hall is the 1796 home of Kentucky's first senator, John Brown. The Orlando Brown House is the adjacent 1835 home of Orlando Brown, John Brown's son.

At the Orlando Brown House, visitors can see the special exhibit of tea time accoutrements featuring tea cups, kettles, and other tea time items from the 19th and early 20th centuries. At Liberty Hall, visitors will see the circa 1810 dining room set up for a family meal, family bedrooms, and will learn of the restoration in progress at the site. The Liberty Hall gardens will also be open with walking trails and fall flowers in bloom.

The free admission opportunity is part of Smithsonian Magazine's fifth annual Museum Day, a celebration of culture, learning, and the dissemination of knowledge. Over 1,000 museums across the country are participating in this year's Museum Day. CITGO is the national sponsor of the event.
